



PRIVATE ANTHOLOGIE by jiri valoch and some very exciting new texts by various czechoslovakian concretists including hirsal, honys, burda, kolarova & othersfrom Casilla 2454, La Cruz de Carrasco, Montevideo, Uruguay comes OVUM 10 five texts by Clemente Padin. somewhere between mayer & garnier opening up into new spaces thru sheer compression into a tight form i.e. the postcard. worth picking up on.... Hans Clavin sent along his HOLLAND VAR 969 from dennekoplaan 11, which blew the mind of McCaffery & me. the toughest thing in all the new poesie is to keep in touch with what is ACTUALLY going down. anthologies have become a pile of proliferating bullshit in which the same old favorites are trotted out over & over again leading one inevitably to despair & boredom. thus the joy of getting hold of NEUE TEXTE 4 or this book of CLAVIN's. Clavin covers a broad sweep including letraset pieces, some photo collage, a few post-semiotic pieces, & wrings a few of the old changes in some surprising twists that makes the book a constant delight. if you're at all interested in the new poesie pick up on this. don't get hassled by definition. "concrete" is in flux. keep with the flow and see what happens. this book of Clavin's offers possibilities of change that are a gas....i picked up a couple of small books of local poetry. the first is an untitled amalgam of poems by Tim Inkster & photographs by Paul Campbell. nice tight images by both. contemplation pieces that work. available from Tim Inkster at 398 Brunswick Avenue, Toronto 179, Ontario. the second piece is less successful as poetry but is an interesting experiment in format. 3 poems by 3 poets published under the title COLOURS OF BLACKNESS (LITTLE SUNLESS POEMS FROM CANADA). a small square of dark brown that opens up in four directions giving u eventually a small cross. of the 3 poets (Vera Frenkel, Bob Burdett, & Russell McRae) Frenkel's poem is the best simply because she doesn't try as hard and in her simplicity makes her point searingly, probably available thru the Village Bookstore....the summer 1970 issue of QUARRY (box 1061, Kingston, Ontario) contains work by Tom Marshall, Patrick Lane, Stuart MacKinnon, Michael Ondaatje, Wayne Clifford, C.H. Gervais, Doug Barbour, Joan Finnigan, R.D. Jones & Peter Stevens as well as others. along with BLEW OINTMENT, IS, CIRCULAR CAUSATION, BLACK MOSS, Quarry is known one of the relevant canadian littles to pick up on for keeping up with english canadian poetry....speaking of C.H. two goodies he has edited come our way out of Kings WINDSOR, the first of which is WINDSOR SALT a collection of poetry by Windsor poets. includes Len Gasparini, Peter Stevens, C.H.Gervais, Dorothy Farmiloe, Eugene McNamara and others. also from C.H. BLACK MOSS volume 2 number 1 which includes work by among others Pat Lane, David Helwig & David La Bute. it also includes a heavy put-down review of Nelson Ball's FORCE/ MOVEMENTS which you all received a while back by Eugene McNamara. McNamara insists on taking a stance which could only be termed radical stupidity with regard to anything unfamiliar. & the idea of enjoying poetry seems foreign now i wouldn't feel so bad about this were it not that the only prom person that ever seems to get sent copies of ganglia press books to review no matter who i send them to is Eugene Mcnamara. this is usually the point where i should jam in an OPEN LETTER TO EUGENE MCNAMARA. wake up and live kid! the pity is that mcnamara's poems reveal him to be a sensitive person leading me to believ e that either his poems are lies or his reviews are. anyway. pick up on BLACK MOSS. always worth reading.....Miroljub Todorovic has sent along three publications outlining his position which he defines as Signalism. one is a collection of his poem pieces called SIGNAL. there is as well a second larger collection called KYBERNO and a sheet which is basically a recap of signal. what with being in & out of town all summer i haven't really had a chance to sit down & get into these. his experiments with code are intriguing. much of what he's doing seems to come close to what mccaffery & i have defined in terms of a post semiotic poetry while retaining elements from older poesies. more when i've had more time to get into them. available from Miroljub at Servis Saveza Udruzenja Pravnika Jugoslavije, Beograde, Proleterskih Brigada 74. send him money, don't ask me how much....

some goodies from very stone house, p.o. box 3007, vancouver 3, b.c. canada, that have been out for awhile but that i hadn't gotten around to mentioning are a series of posters & pamphlets. seymour mayne's THE GIGOLO TEASPOON is a revolutionary poem/poster SHUCK OLD SYSTEM/CUCK OLD CYSTEM. joe rosenblatt's THE GUEST one of joe's very fine ape poems as a poster. two moving poems by Pat Lane dome as posters FOR RITA - IN ASYLUM & CALGARY CITY JAIL. TICKLISH TICLICORICE is a series of sound changes & a drawing by seymour mayne. OVERHEARD AT THE ORACLE (poems based on the I Ching) by Marya Fiamengo which is far and away the best stuff i've ever read by her. in addition to these six posters there are three pamphlets of seymour's nonsense & concrete journeys of which, for my money, the best is MANIMALS a beautiful trip into the netherworld beyond children's literature. worth looking at tho needing a lot more development are ANEWD & EARSEEDEARSEEDEAR/SEEDEARSEEDEARSEE/DEARSEEDEARSEEDthe ELFIN PLOT continues. Ludvig Feller (formerly Czechoslovakian & now living in Berlin) & Paul Wilson (canadian teaching in Prague) were thru talking about activities in the streets & fields in Czechoslovakia with poets raising poems & poem/sculptures & living gifts for the wood gods. Jiri Valoch mentioned in a couple of recent letters that he had been making some "realizations in nature - something as land-art-poetry & some land-art-actions (team-works, coordinated by me)" & promises photo-documentation at a later date. Paul Wilson has also promised to send back more news from Prague. i continue my offer of printing any and all reports of such activity sent to me. in this line see grOnk series 5 #8 which is a tiny collection of documents sent me from France including Bory's NIGHT & DAY AWAKENERS BIPOINT POETRY MANIFESTO as promised ahile back. John Giorno is also sending along bulletines from GIORNO POETRY SYSTEMS, The Museum of Modern Art, 11 west 53 street, New York, N.Y. 10019, USA including the phone number for DIAL-A-POEM ([212] 956-7032) & Giorno's proposal for a bread strike "until they end the Asian War, free Bobby Seale, Tim Leary, John Sinclair & all political prisoners, and repeal the laws against marijuana." if you're american you should do it for your health since the bread produced contains more chemicals than wheat hence "VITAMIN ENRICHED". he further suggests that the surplus wheat could go to the "hungry people in the third world". in the last two issues of elfin plot i received (published and mailed out free to interested souls from Andrew Suknaski, Wood Mountain, Saskatchewan, Canada) Andy Suknaski mentions his own most recent plottings - "Spring 1970 - after 3 day blizzard at wd mtn in south country (saskatchewan) elves walked birney's EDDY POEM seth wade's "drip rip ip p p p" & a. suknaski's "muse use us" into corniced snowbanks in coulees at edge of WOOD MOUNTAIN. these were photographed as photomes to be preserved after the snow melted. *** suknaski's Beloved poem on two sheets of paper left beside RED FOX" poem in its entirety reads BELOVED BE LOVE LEB. "which a.s. & sid marty wrote tribute poems about still lays beside RED FOX who likely still hangs from his barbwire fence (after being shot by some hunter & left there like a sick joke) but then hail storms may have pounded BELOVED poem into the earth & stone beneath RED FOX who likely still weathers the storms though dead... so marty & suknaski remember him in poems *** Birney's EDDY POEM is now a waxcandle mobile ... mobilecandle-pieces with text that burns & "turns like an eddy" as it destroys itself before suknaski's movie camera that 11 include lovers avalanches and climbers rappeling down mtn faces... turning as they descend over overhangs. the movie 8mm will also include canilised quotations from al purdy's KENNEDY POEM ... passages on sides of sandcast candles" "randy bradshaw took 35mm slides of these -- a.suknaski filmed the candles. slides will be given to birney purdy & GRIZZLY HOUSE in banff to be used in lightstrobe shows by terry brennan this winter. *** over n out ... " ELFIN PLOT issues i have (2 & 4) contain poems by Seth Wade, Earle Birney, Richard Latta, Andrew Suknaski, Eggardo-Antonio Vigo, Terry Brennan, Joanne Meis, Sid Marty, Esther Birney, Barry McKinnon & lots of others: since it's worth reprinting i'll give you the full reprint of the end of 69 statement of position from ELFIN PLOT. "ELFIN PLOT is operated by a spare company of penniless elves who intend to remain that way -- nothing from ELFIN PLOT will ever be sold, Do not fear -- this COMPANY will never be applying for

a CANADA COUNCIL GRANT -- we took out vow of pverty long before our legend

started. We intend to spread our magical madness forever -- we have zillions of slices of bread left in our loaf. In 1969 we sent out poems down the NORTH SASKATCHEWAN RIVER -- poems inside film cannisters wired to children's boats -- with FAITH & HOPE those poems will reach the ATLANTIC OCEAN and other shores. We climbed mountains to plant BIRNEY & bpNichol poems (& other poems) in cairns on mountain summits in the CANADIAN ROCKIES -- show us higher libraries on this "bright rock" apart from TIBETAN MONASTRIES. We folded sheets of poems into paper gliders (NOT THE PLAIN SIMPLE GLIDERS WE FOLD IN NORTH AMERICA -- WE FOLDED THEM THE WAY EUROPEAN KIDS HAVE FOLDED THEM FOR CENTURIES -- A WAY THAT BALANCES A GLIDER PERFECTLY & WILL ENABLE IT TO SAIL THE EDDYING WINDS OF THE WORLD FOREVER). Nonsense? Remember, in CANADIAN LIT there was once a first statement mag -- we may very well serve as your LAST STATEMENT bright planet if you fulfill your promise to crack yourself in half. Foolishness! Well, our glider poems were liberated 12,000 feet above the CANADIAN PRAIRIES -- we trust some of them will sail the high winds of the globe forever -- until they slip into the moon's gravity after "final flash" anyway. We may even appear at your next POET CRITIC conference with poems written on paperwings which we will slip into the shoes of all critics simply to lighten things - etc - for them & poets." somewhere in here i should metnion michael ondaatje"s fridge which has plastic letters with magnets in them attached to it for spontaneous destruct poeming. we've got shots of one series we'll be publishing in a forthcoming documentaion ELFIN PLOT issue of grOnk,.... Bill Bisset is still publishing Blew Ointment & books. recent & hot from him are RED LADY a reprint of this D.A.Levy story. beautiful. WIRE by Ken West. has some amazing drawings by the author in it. HOCHELAGA new poems by Maxine Gadd a very very fine fine poetess. EYES OPEN which is best described by Bill "concrete trad n prose" with bissett drawings. & BIll BISSET'S most recent and most amazing book to dat S THE STORY I DO. Bissett just keeps growing & chanings changing & constantly defying attempts to classify him. whew! coming soon is the special occupation issew of blew ointment which includes just about everybody so get it. only 2 dollars. Bill will tell you more about blew ointment books if you write him at box 8590, station h, vancouver 5, british columbia, canada. DO NOT UNDER ANY CIRCUMSTANCE PUT THE NAME BLEW OINTMENT PRESS on the envelope. leads to hassles.....Dennis Reid has been all along sending me catalogues for all the shows at the National Gallery in Ottawa where he's the assistant curator. the latest is the GROUP of 7 catalogue for the show he helped organized & thus it is he who has written in. since this is always touted as just about the only canadian art movement pick up on this & read Dennis's very intelligent & informed history..... Ed Varney sent along his book of poems SUMMER SONGS which is published thru INTERMEDIA in Vancouver. i don't remember their address offhand. it's a lovely little book & shows Ed's attention to detail. nice to read to hold to look at. groovey....two recent things from COACH HOUSE PRESS, 401 (rear) Huron Street, Toronto, CANADA are Robert Fones KOLLAGES & Judy Copithorne's RUNES. both are a gas. i repeat that for my money Copithorne is one of the few clear successors in the area blake was exploring between the graphic & the written world. RAIN also makes this clear. RUNES has only one uneven touch which is the inside title page. other than that everything flows together & is a constant delight & surprise. KOLLAGES includes a beautiful yellow button & 22 collages in a box. Fones style is seamless & amusing & as i keep saying well worth picking up on.a bunch of things have come thru the mails from the ZAJ group in spain who can be reached thru juan hidalgo, batalla del salado, 1, madrid-7, spain, including Jose Luis Castillejo's statement on Modern writing which we take this opportunity to reprint in its entirety.....

Modern writing

Modern or advanced writing is a direct and independent medium, i. e. it realizes and gives presence to a set of relationships without the need of further dependance (as it happened till now in literature) on other media.

(Words, syllables, stories, sounds, psychology, music, etc., are no longer needed in writing: advanced writing can do without intermediate elements.)

Modern writing is neither symbolic nor descriptive. It does not look for the possession of more things or objects, not even theoretical or imagined. Its purpose is the purpose of all modern art: to reduce necessity.

The freedom achieved by writing (as a "medium") may perhaps become an inspiration (a "metaphor") of what could be achieved elsewhere (in the "reality"), independently and without imitation.
